Florida Migrant Student Information Exchange

Welcome to the Florida Migrant Student Information Exchange (**FLMSIX**). This System is to be accessed by authorized users only.

The FLMSIX is a web-based portal that links states' migrant student record databases to facilitate the national exchange of migrant students' educational information among the states. The primary purpose of FLMSIX is to make migrant student information available to authorized school personnel to support them in making decisions on student enrollment, grade or course placement, and accrual of credits.

The timely transfer of education records for migrant children between schools has been a longstanding challenge. Migrant children often enroll in multiple schools for varying amounts of time each year as their families migrate in search of temporary or seasonal work in agriculture or fishing. MEP staffs continue to find it difficult to share and consolidate student information that schools, local educational agencies, and states collect on migrant children in a timely and meaningful way that helps school personnel make appropriate decisions when the students arrive. These conditions and those shown below prompted the need for an exchange of records.

High Movement — Highly mobile migrant student population

Short Notice — Students move from state-to-state often without notice

Lack of Data — Timely and accurate educational information not always available

Placement Errors — Students placed in incorrect courses or grades

Loss of MEP Services — Students not provided the most beneficial MEP services

MSIX Protocols & Procedures

- Aligns with Protocols and Procedures for Florida Inter/Intrastate Transfer/Exchange (FMIP) of Migrant Student Records
- Covers MSIX account management as well as student record transmission procedures
- Implementation is key!
 - Monitoring (Compliance Item BIC-2)

MSIX User Reports

- Two reports printed for your review:
 - **Active** = accounts that are currently active and ready for use
 - **Inactive** = accounts that are disabled (locked) due to inactivity
- **Homework Assignment**
 - Please review document at your leisure
 - Provide updates to Jay prior to end of ISM

FLOUR Group is back!!!

- FLOUR group is comprised of MSIX district data administrators and select MEP data entry staff.
- The purpose of the group is to (1) discuss issues related to MSIX/FASTER, (2) voice concerns and ideas that are then shared with SUGAR group and (3) discuss information gathered from SUGAR calls.
