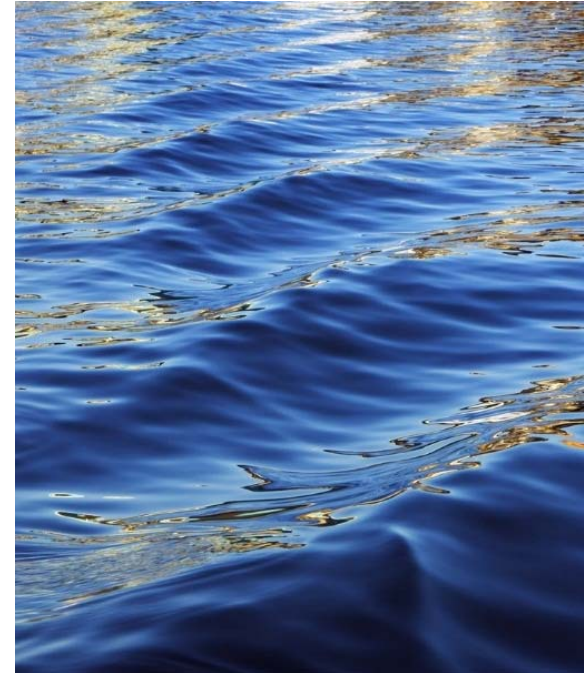

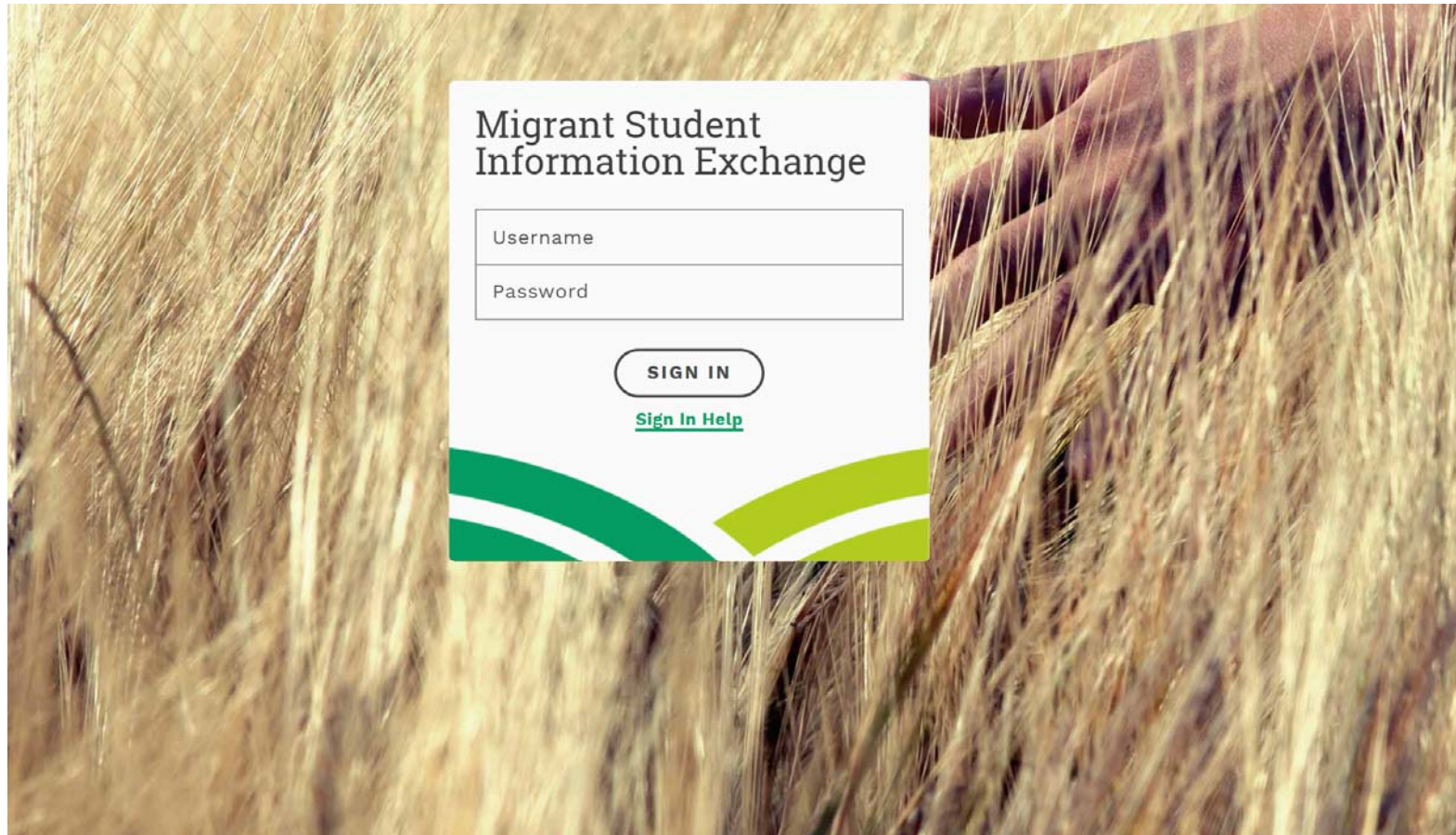

Knowledge Check (Part II)



GROUP ACTIVITY

True or False

A migratory qualifying worker will always retain their status for 36 months.

GROUP ACTIVITY

Answer: False

Per Office of Migrant Education (OME) Guidance (Q113)

Each time an individual is identified for the purpose of completing a new COE with new qualifying arrival date (QAD) for a migratory child, the recruiter and reviewers of the COE must determine if, at the time they are reviewing the information, the individual documented in #4 **is** (current tense) a “migratory agricultural worker”.

GROUP ACTIVITY

True or False

A migratory child will always retain their status for 36 months.

GROUP ACTIVITY

Answer: False

Using a scenario from OME Guidance (Q112), in Florida:

A COE cannot be completed and approved for a child that does not meet all of the program eligibility criteria. A child no longer meets the definition of a “migratory child” if the child did not make a qualifying move within the preceding 36 months with a parent who **is** a migratory agricultural worker [emphasis added].

GROUP ACTIVITY

True or False

Recruiters can document a prior move as 4a in Section III, #4 if the Migratory Qualifying Worker did not engage in qualifying work during the current move.

GROUP ACTIVITY

Answer: True

Using a scenario from OME Guidance (Q111), in Florida:

There may be circumstances in which the recruiter would document a previous qualifying move in #4, and not the most recent qualifying move. For example, if the individual made a qualifying move, but has not yet actively sought work, the recruiter may choose to document a prior qualifying move in #4 and select “a”.

GROUP ACTIVITY

Answer: True

Using a scenario from OME Guidance (Q111), in Florida:

This is assuming the individual can provide the date and locations for the move (to demonstrate that the move meets the current definition of a “qualifying move”), and that he/she engaged in the qualifying work “soon after” that move.

GROUP ACTIVITY

True or False

A child must meet the economic necessity eligibility criteria if they are moving from a different location than the migratory qualifying worker.

GROUP ACTIVITY

Answer: **True**

Non-Regulatory Guidance A1:

A1. What is the definition of a “migratory child”?

A child is a “migratory child” if the following conditions are met:

3. The child made a **qualifying move** in the preceding 36 months as a migratory agricultural worker or a migratory fisher, or did so with, or to join a parent/guardian or spouse who is a migratory agricultural worker or a migratory fisher; *and*
4. **With regard to the qualifying move** identified in paragraph 3, above, **the child moved due to economic necessity** from one residence to another residence, and from one school district to another

GROUP ACTIVITY

Answer: **True**

Non-Regulatory Guidance D1:

D1. “What is a qualifying move”?

Under section 1309(5) of the ESEA, a qualifying move is:

1. made due to economic necessity: *and*
2. from one residence to another residence: *and*
3. from one school district to another school district

GROUP ACTIVITY

True or False

Recertifications (residency verifications) must be conducted every year.

GROUP ACTIVITY

Answer: True

Florida Manual For Identification and Recruitment, pg.60-61:
Recertification

Families/youth previously identified as migrant must be revisited annually to determine whether the family/youth has made another Qualifying Move (QM) out of the district and back again during the year. These follow-ups ensure that eligible families/youth continue to be served under the FMEP.
