



## Migrant Student Scholarship Opportunities

Migrant Education Programs throughout Florida are charged with assisting qualifying migrant students with the transition to post secondary education. The following scholarship information is provided for migrant educators to make available to migrant students and parents interested in pursuing higher education. Most school districts also offer additional scholarships at the local level. Some scholarships specifically designed for migrant students by the local agri-business community. All local scholarship information is most easily attained by contacting the student's guidance counselor.

Most scholarships require proof of acceptance into a technical institute, college or university; therefore, students should apply to post-secondary institutions before the end of the first semester during their senior year of high school.

***NOTE: Undocumented students may apply for the scholarships preceded by an asterisk \*.***
