DATA REPORTING

Survey 5 vs. MSIX

Survey 5 Reporting Period

- Data used for federal reporting purposes
- Data transmitted to state student database
- Record transmissions sent during performance period
- Performance period (September 1- August 31)

MSIX System

- Data currently used for school enrollment and course placement
- Data transmitted through FASTER to MSIX
- Records transmissions are ongoing
- MEP Enrollment Date* (August 1 – July 31)

Survey 5 Reporting Period

- Purpose
 - Reporting periods allow districts to send local student information to the state for reporting purposes both at the state and federal levels
 - Survey 5 data is used primarily for reporting federal program information to the USDE

Survey 5

- Data validity
 - Verifying data submissions to the State Student Information system is crucial as those data are used to determine many factors, including migrant counts

Migrant counts = state allocation → local funding

- Deadlines

Processing period:

July 28 – August 31, 2015

Amendment Period:

August 31 – September 30

Cutoff date:* (for federal reporting purposes)

October 9, 2015

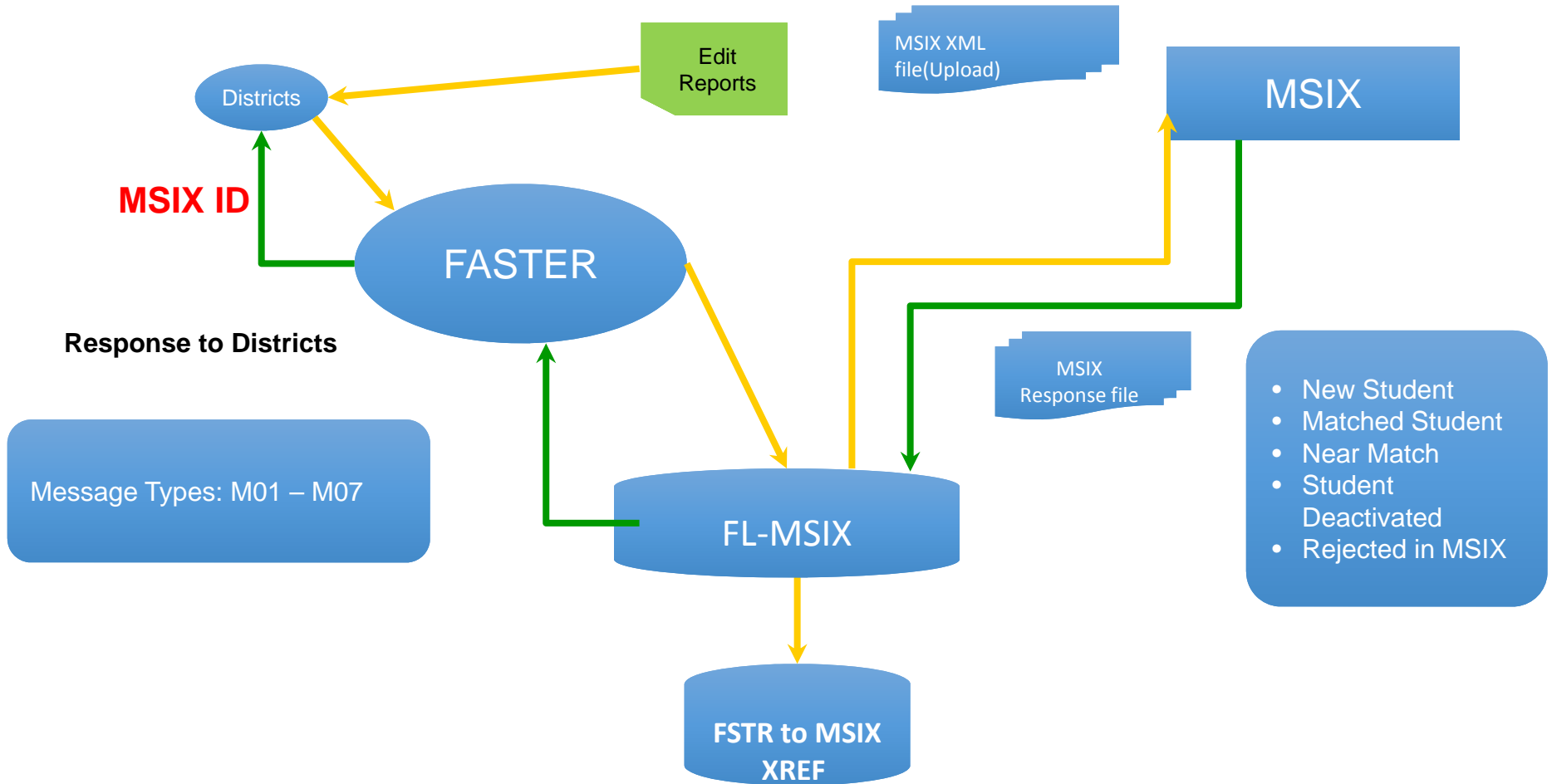
General Information & Updates

MSIX Timeframe (as set forth by USDE):

- When to send records:
 - Upon completion of enrollment – immediately after class assignments
 - At the end of every grade reporting period
 - At the end of every school term
 - Upon student's withdrawal from school or from the Migrant Education Program

What happens once a record is sent from LEA to MSIX?

FASTER Responses are provided to Districts with **MSIX ID**



What is FLMSIX?

The FLMSIX is a state version of the MSIX web-based portal that contains student demographic, course, enrollment and assessment data that is transmitted from the district-level to MSIX.

Florida Migrant Student Information Exchange

Welcome to the Florida Migrant Student Information Exchange (**FLMSIX**). This System is to be accessed by authorized users only.

The FLMSIX is a web-based portal that links states' migrant student record databases to facilitate the national exchange of migrant students' educational information among the states. The primary purpose of FLMSIX is to make migrant student information available to authorized school personnel to support them in making decisions on student enrollment, grade or course placement, and accrual of credits.

The timely transfer of education records for migrant children between schools has been a longstanding challenge. Migrant children often enroll in multiple schools for varying amounts of time each year as their families migrate in search of temporary or seasonal work in agriculture or fishing. MEP staffs continue to find it difficult to share and consolidate student information that schools, local educational agencies, and states collect on migrant children in a timely and meaningful way that helps school personnel make appropriate decisions when the students arrive. These conditions and those shown below prompted the need for an exchange of records.

High Movement — Highly mobile migrant student population

Short Notice — Students move from state-to-state often without notice

Lack of Data — Timely and accurate educational information not always available

Placement Errors — Students placed in incorrect courses or grades

Loss of MEP Services — Students not provided the most beneficial MEP services

In response to this challenge and a Congressional mandate to link the existing migrant student information systems, the U.S. Department of Education (ED) implemented the Migrant Student Record Exchange Initiative.



What is the turnaround time to see a response file on a record sent to MSIX?

- Districts can view response files based on when data is submitted:
 - **Before 5PM = 2 business days**
 - **After 5PM = 3 business days**
- FLMSIX transmits records on a nightly basis during the work week.

MSIX User Accounts

- Review list of MSIX user accounts for local MEP
- Determine if changes are needed
 - MSIX user role
 - Staff no longer with MEP – deactivate
- Submit changes back to Jay and updates will be made in MSIX

The Future of MSIX...

- If proposed regulations are passed, MSIX will become the primary method of exchanging migrant student records
 - Data quality at the district and state levels is key!
 - USDE will begin using MSIX as a source to collect migrant student counts (future funding tied to MSIX)
 - FLMSIX can be a tool to ensure data quality for districts

MIGRANT DATA ELEMENTS

Migrant Program Reporting

- Report all migrants identified and served (or identified, not served), ages 0-21:
- In **2015-16SY**, the date of birth range falls in range of **09/01/93 – 08/31/16**, inclusive

Migrant Status Term

- What's new?
 - Term codes have been slightly redefined
 - Code "X" is now a stand-alone
 - New codes capture non-attenders (0-2, Pre-K and OSYs)

Migrant Status Term (School Attenders)

- B – Enrolled (in an MEP)/served in BOTH Regular 180-day school year (**Regular school day/extended**) and summer term.
 - This code should be used for a student identified but not served in the regular 180-day school year, but then served in the summer term
- D – Enrolled and/or served ONLY in regular 180-day school year with services provided during the **regular school day only**.

Migrant Status Term (School Attenders)

- E – Enrolled and/or served ONLY in regular 180-day school year with some or all services provided during an **extended day/week**.
- S – Enrolled/Served ONLY in summer term.
 - The student must be served in a partially or fully funded migrant funded service component designed especially for migrant students enrolled in conventional summer school (or intercession) in order for the student to be coded as “S.”

Migrant Status Term (School Attenders)

- X – Identified, NOT served – use this code if the child has been identified at any time during the school year or summer session, but NOT served (through the PK-12 school system or as a non-attender)
 - Includes
 - Emancipated youth and
 - Pre-K aged children including those below three years of age (who are not enrolled in Pre-K classes)

Migrant Status Term (non-attenders)

- **NOTE:** “**Enrolled**” for these codes applies to enrolled in the MEP, not school enrollment.
- T – A non-attender served in BOTH the regular 180-day school term (Regular School Day/Extended) and summer term
 - This code should also be used for a student identified, but not served during the 180-day school year but served during the summer term
- U – A non-attender enrolled/served ONLY in the regular 180-day school term
 - Regular school day only

Migrant Status Term (non-attenders)

- V – A non-attender enrolled/served ONLY in the regular 180-day school year with some or all services provided during an **extended day/week**.
 - Some or all services provided during an extended day/week
- W – A non-attender enrolled/served ONLY in summer term

MEP Enrollment Date

- Date entered must fall within current school-year **beginning August 1, 2015**
- Date range: August 1 – July 31 of each year
- Can include **one** of the following dates:
 - The date the child met MEP eligibility (based on COE)
 - The COE recertification date
 - The school enrollment date

Federal/State Project, Area and Model

- Five Character Code
 - 1st digit = Project Type
 - 2nd digit = Subject Area
 - 3rd/4th digit = Model
 - **5th digit = Service Provider**

5th digit now applicable for 2015-16

Federal/State Project, Area and Model Service Provider

- **New Code T**

- The Migrant Education Program (MEP) funded instructional service in **reading, mathematics** or **high school credit accrual** was provided by a **teacher only**.
- MEP funded services provided by a paraprofessional **ARE NOT** captured in this code.
- MEP funded services provided by a teacher and paraprofessional **ARE NOT** captured in this code.

Federal/State Project, Area and Model Service Provider

- **NEW EDIT #28**

In Federal/State Project, Area and Model if

- the first digit, Project Type, equals 2 or 5 and
- the second digit, Subject Area, equals 1, 2, or 3, or
- the third and fourth digits, Model, equals 12 or 13 then,

the fifth digit, Service Provider, must equal 0 or T.
For all other combinations of code the fifth digit
must equal 0. –record rejected–
