

STAMP Eligibility Scenario Handout

1. A family of five move into your district to pick tomatoes. The family is made up of dad, mom, and their three children Lorena (12), Marcos (5) and Letty (3). Worker and his family moved to your area in September 2013.
2. A family of six moves into your district in October of 2015, so that mom and dad can work in the strawberry fields. The family is made up of dad, mom, and their four children ages 6, 11, 12, 16, and 19. Are the children eligible for the FL MEP?
3. Worker moves to your district on November of 2015 to pick oranges after being in North Carolina. He was able to obtain a job right away since his wife (20) and child (3) who reside in your district, notified him of the job. Worker is excited to be returning to his family.
4. Worker, his wife and two school age children, moved to FL four months ago specifically to work in the celery fields. Family arrived into your neighboring district. The worker has had to commute for the last four months and has just lost his means of transportation. Instead of quitting his job, he decided to move his whole family to your district. The school notifies you that the family arrived in your district one week ago.
5. Two Parents and their 8 year old son moved together February 11, 2016, in search of any type work. The mother has not been able to find work, but the father is currently employed picking blueberries. He just started the job on April 1, 2016. Immediately after the move, he worked a short-term construction job at an apartment complex.
6. A family of seven move into your district on January 21, 2016 from Georgia in order to obtain work in the strawberry fields. Family consists of dad, mom, Lucas (6), Lucia (11), Miguel and Andrew (17) and Karla (18). Three of the children, ages 17, 18 stayed in Georgia to complete school work but joined their family on March 7, 2016.
7. Worker and his family left Arizona and arrived in your district five months ago. The family searched for construction work but was unable to obtain it, due to economic necessity both worker and his wife had to take work in the strawberry fields. They obtained work in the fields 20 days after they arrived.

8. Worker (23), his wife (20) and their 8 month old child move into your district 10 months ago. Worker recently lost his job in New Mexico and moved to obtain a job picking strawberries. Both parents are high school dropouts.

9. Family of five came to your district six months ago looking for any kind of work they could find. Family is made up of mom, dad, and three school age children. Worker applied at two tomato fields but has not been called back.

10. Worker and wife moved into your district on June 13, 2016, to work in the blueberry fields, they have a nine year old son in their home country who they provide for. Child has never been in the U.S and joined his parents on March 26, 2016.

11. A family of four move into your district three months ago from Georgia where they picked watermelon. Family consists of dad, mom and Emmanuel (14) and Enrique (19). Father moved to work in construction and may take field work if no other jobs are available.

12. Three months ago, worker and wife moved to your district from their home country to pick oranges for the very first time. Their family consist of dad, mom, and two school age children. Family first arrived to Georgia with some family. The children were left with their aunt and uncle there, while the parents worked in Florida since there was no adequate housing for the children in this area.

STAMP Eligibility Scenarios-KEY

1. A family of five move into your district to pick tomatoes. The family is made up of dad, mom, and their three children Lorena (12), Marcos (5) and Letty (3). Worker and his family moved to your area in September 2013.
[Not eligible, move occurred more than 36 months ago.](#)
2. A family of six moves into your district in October of 2015, so that mom and dad can work in the strawberry fields. The family is made up of dad, mom, and their four children ages 6, 11, 12, 16, and 19. Are the children eligible for the FL MEP?
[Possibly. Three are, ask for 19 year old's school completion.](#)
3. Worker moves to your district on November of 2015 to pick oranges after being in North Carolina. He was able to obtain a job right away since his wife (20) and child (3) who reside in your district, notified him of the job. Worker is excited to be returning to his family.
[Not eligible, wife and children did not make a move across district lines.](#)
4. Worker, his wife and two school age children, moved to FL four months ago specifically to work in the celery fields. Family arrived into your neighboring district. The worker has had to commute for the last four months and has just lost his means of transportation. Instead of quitting his job, he decided to move his whole family to your district. The school notifies you that the family arrived in your district one week ago.
[Not eligible, worker did not move into your district to "obtain" qualifying work but to "keep" it.](#)
5. Two Parents and their 8 year old son moved together February 11, 2016, in search of any type work. The mother has not been able to find work, but the father is currently employed picking blueberries. He just started the job on April 1, 2016. Immediately after the move, he worked a short-term construction job at an apartment complex.
[Not eligible, worker's purpose of the move was for "any" work and work was not obtained "soon after".](#)
6. A family of seven move into your district on January 21, 2016 from Georgia in order to obtain work in the strawberry fields. Family consists of dad, mom, Lucas (6), Lucia (11), Miguel and Andrew (17) and Karla (18). Three of the children, ages 17, 18 stayed in Georgia to complete school work but joined their family on March 7, 2016.
[Eligible, "to-join" move. There will be a need for two COEs.](#)
7. Worker and his family left Arizona and arrived in your district five months ago. The family searched for construction work but was unable to obtain it, due to economic necessity both worker and his wife had to take work in the strawberry fields. They obtained work in the fields 20 days after they arrived.
[Not eligible, purpose of the move was for non-qualifying work.](#)

8. Worker (23), his wife (20) and their 8 month old child move into your district 10 months ago. Worker recently lost his job in New Mexico and moved to obtain a job picking strawberries. Both parents are high school dropouts.
[Eligible, wife only. Child born after the move.](#)
9. Family of five came to your district six months ago looking for any kind of work they could find. Family is made up of mom, dad, and three school age children. Worker applied at two tomato fields but has not been called back.
[Possible 4ci/4cii move, does the worker have prior history and/or credible evidence or PQM.](#)
10. Worker and wife moved into your district on June 13, 2016, to work in the blueberry fields, they have a nine year old son in their home country who they provide for. Child has never been in the U.S and joined his parents on March 26, 2016.
[Possible "to-join" move. Why didn't the child move with the worker? How long has it been since the child and worker have been apart? Is this child's move enabling the worker to obtain the job?](#)
11. A family of four move into your district three months ago from Georgia where they picked watermelon. Family consists of dad, mom and Emmanuel (14) and Enrique (19). Father moved to work in construction and may take field work if no other jobs are available.
[Not eligible on the move to your district, purpose of the move was for non-qualifying work. May be eligible on PQM.](#)
12. Three months ago, worker and wife moved to your district from their home country to pick oranges for the very first time. Their family consist of dad, mom, and two school age children. Family first arrived to Georgia with some family. The children were left with their aunt and uncle there, while the parents worked in Florida since there was no adequate housing for the children in this area.
[Not eligible, children did not move across school district lines. Possible PQM.](#)
